
LOCAL BOY RETURNS The legend started more than a half century ago when 22-year old Donald



Matsui returned to LANA'I, the island of his birth. In his sophomore year at Lanai High School, he transferred to Mid Pacific Institute and graduated in 1949. After receiving a bachelor degree in education from Gustavus Adolpus

College, Minnesota in 1953, he taught one year at Moanalua Intermediate, Honolulu. The following year in September 1954, he moved back to Lanai and resumed his teaching career at his childhood alma mater.

HIS CAREER Educated as a Physical Education teacher, he immediately was hired the school's Athletic Director, and in turn became Head Coach of the Pinelads Varsity Basketball team. If that weren't enough for his first year at LHES, he was assigned as Junior class advisor for the class of the '56. From full time teacher to substitute, he held multiple positions concurrently for 70 years, until his retirement in 2012. Because of his services in numerous capacities, he influenced the lives of hundreds of LHES students at diverse levels. This included over 250 boys who played basketball under his helm of 21

years as head coach from 1955-1971 and 1976-1979.

HIS FAMILY At LHES, Coach Matsui met elementary teacher, Kitoshi Kodama; married her in 1955; and they eventually had three children



(Dorrye, Darryl Brian). Their combined dedication to serve the students never faltered even while raising a young family. It should be noted that Mrs. Matsui routinely supported her husband away from the public limelight. Darryl, following his father's footsteps, currently is the Assistant Basketball Coach for the Chaminade University Silverswords. Donald & Kitoshi, grandparents of 2 grandchildren, reside in Lana'i City.

HIS CHARACTER Coach Matsui is a humble man. Instead of attending a recognition dinner in his behalf, he would rather socialize with friends at Manele Beach and "talk story" about old times. Where should we place him among renowned

basketball coaches of all times? He would be among the first if the school should display a hall of fame coach's showcase at the New Gym! Would we describe him with this statement: "What John

Wooden is to UCLA, Donald Matsui is to LHES and more."? The answer lies within the players. Many of these boys he coached, emerged out of the woodwork of small town USA – Lana'i City – and became outstanding leaders and respectable citizens in the nation's communities.

TRIBUTE To pay homage to Donald Matsui for his years of dedicated coaching, teams from the past



planned a surprised honorary banquet. Organized by a committee of players from '70 & '71, the affair was held at the Natsunoya Tea House on Oahu. As usual, the coach refused to attend the "family" dinner, until the family told him that the players from the 1971 team was going to be there to celebrate their 2nd place finish in the Single A Basketball State Tournament. The players would be delighted if the coach happened to show up.

MAHALO COACH

At the banquet room entrance, the 1971 team greeted the coach and his family with handshakes and hugs.



The coach appeared elated. Then he saw them – the legendary 1955 to 1958 group – sitting at the far end of the room. As humble as he has been all these years, he could not hold back his emotions; he knew instantly that this was not a one team of old basketball players' celebration. His players had gathered to honor him. His "grand entrance" was so touching that Master of Ceremony Nelson Tamashiro '70 forgot to announce their arrival:




